Coffin protest by Eljamel's victims

HOLYROOD: Campaigners air frustration at health secretary

Victims whose lives have been impacted by neurosurgeon Sam Eljamel gathered outside the Scottish Parliament with a coffin to show their anger over public inquiry delays.

The campaigners addressed the SNP's new

health secretary Neil Gray about when they can expect progress on the proposed hearing into the former NHS Tayside employee's botched work.

Jules Rose from Kinross, who has been leading the fight, said: "I did not think we'd be back here in February doing an even bigger

protest. The eldest patient that has approached me was 80. The clock's ticking. We don't have time to sit around."

Mr Gray told The Courier: "There is due process that has to be gone through. I hope we can make swift progress."
